LOOK FORWARD TO		I look forward to going on holidays to Italy.
LOOK FOR		Tom is looking for a job. He has been jobless for 2 months.
LOOK AFTER = take care of		She often looks after her younger sister when her parents are away.
LOOK UP		I don't know this word. Could you look it up in an online dictionary?
LOOK AT		Why are you looking at me like that? Do I have something on my face?
GROW UP		Stop behaving in such a silly way! Grow up!
BRING UP = raise		It's not easy to bring up a child.
FALL OUT WITH = have an argument		I've never fallen out with my best friend. We get on well.
MAKE UP WITH		Have you already made up with your mum after your last argument?
GO OUT (WITH)		Let's go out tonight! Kate has been going out with Tom for a month.
GET ON / ALONG WITH SB		Sarah doesn't get on with her brother, they argue all the time.
BREAK UP WITH = SPLIT UP WITH		They broke up because they had fallen out last week.
CHEER SB UP		Why are you sad? What can I do to cheer you up?
TAKE OFF		Take off your shoes! They are dirty and I've just mopped the floor. My plane takes off at 6 a.m.
PUT ON		Put on your scarf! It's freezing cold.
TRY ON		Do you always try on clothes before you buy them?
GO WITH = match		Your shoes don't go with your leather handbag.
DRESS UP (AS)		I'll dress up as a pirate for our fancy-dress party. They dressed up and went to the party.
CALL OFF = cancel		I have to call off our meeting. I'm sick.
BREAK DOWN		Our car broke down yesterday and it hasn't been

		repaired yet.
COUNT ON = RELY ON		I can always count on my friends. They are always there for me.
HANG OUT WITH SB		I enjoy hanging out with my friends after school.
DO UP = renovate		We have to do up our flat. The walls are dirty. Do up your coat before you go out.
EAT OUT		Let's eat out tonight. I don't fancy cooking today.
EAT IN		I don't feel like going out tonight. Let's eat in.
GO OFF = spoil		The milk has gone off! It stinks! Ugh!
MOVE IN / INTO		We'll move in when the house is ready.
MOVE OUT OF		I moved out of my family home when I was 20.
TIDY UP		I try to tidy up my room every Saturday.
WASH UP		The sink is full of dirty dishes and it's your turn to wash up.
STAY IN		If you are not feeling well, you should stay in.
STAY OUT		Tom stayed out late yesterday without telling his parents about it.
ASK SB OUT		I want to ask her out on a date.
FIND OUT		Have you found out anything interesting?
GET UP		What time do you usually get up on weekdays?
WAKE UP		Kate woke up suddenly because she had a nightmare.
TURN ON = SWITCH ON		Could you turn on the light? It's dark in here.
TURN OFF = SWITCH OFF		Could you turn off the TV if you aren't watching it?
TURN DOWN		The music is too loud. Turn it down, please.
TURN UP		I can't hear anything. Turn up the radio, please.
BREAK IN / INTO		Someone broke into their house last week and stole some money.
FALL BEHIND WITH		Kate falls behind with maths and she got an F last week.
CATCH UP WITH		I have to catch up with the school material.

WORK OUT		Tom works out at the gym 3 times a week. I can't work him out.
CUT DOWN ON		I have to cut down on sweets and go on a diet.
GIVE UP		Don't give up! You can do it! Tom gave up smoking last year.
TAKE UP (a hobby)		Tom has taken up judo recently.
BE INTO = be interested in		What are you into? I'm into skiing.
GET IN / INTO		They got into a car and drove away.
GET OUT OF		I went out of the car and went shopping.
GET OFF		What bus stop should I get off?
GET ON		We got on the wrong bus and we got lost.
PUT UP WITH = tolerate		I can't put up with this noise. Could you turn the music down?
PUT AWAY		Put away your clothes! They are everywhere!
RUN OUT OF		We have run out of bread. I'll go get some.
GET INTO (high school)		He managed to get into the best high school in the city.
RUN AWAY		Criminals managed to run away and the police didn't catch them.
CHECK IN		We need to check in our luggage. We'd like to check in.
CHECK OUT		We'd like to check out. Did you enjoy your stay here?
DROP SB OFF		Drop me off at that bus stop, thanks.
PICK SB UP		Could you pick me up from the airport tomorrow?
SET UP (a company)		When did he set up his company? 20 years ago.
BE UP TO		What have you been up to recently?
LET SB DOWN = disappoint		I can always rely on my friend, he has never let me down.
SET OFF = SET OUT		We set off early to be on time.
